### What is a General Construction Operative?

This Apprenticeship has been designed in close consultation with the Construction Industry and sets out to offer operatives an understanding of the Construction / Civil Engineering process.

General construction operatives are trained in setting out for groundwork's, including kerb-laying and paving, drainage laying and testing and carrying out all aspects of concreting, from the testing of fresh concrete to laying and finishing.



### Apprenticeship Summary

<b>Duration</b>	This is a two-year Apprenticeship incorporating a day release programme with a local college with the remainder of the time spent with the our company on various sites, gaining experience and undertaking assessments for the NVQ Diploma.
<b>Entry Requirements</b>	No specific requirements – some candidates may need to attend the college for further tests to attain L1 Functional Skills
<b>Assessment and Training</b>	This is a combination of classroom-based theory and practical training with site assessments
